April Advising Updates

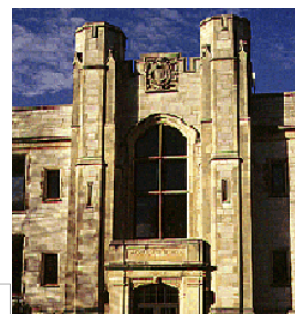
Dear Colleagues,

Students will be prompted to select the appropriate related class when they register for the lecture / lab in their student center in ISIS. Failure to do so will result in a “yield” sign reminding the student to select the appropriate component section.
